2026-03	247	267	Add	Reconsider; is this provisional without a raise? Example for F: 1S-2H; 2S-3H [H are trump unless cancelled by 3S]. Or is it 1S-2H; 2S-4NT=RKB? (Playing Almost 2/1, 3H is NF. Because there is no forcing bid to make hearts trump, 4NT over 2S asks for keycards in hearts!) Define and use "provisional raise" and effects? Research needed, choices to be offered.
2026-03	247	267	Delete	Our Auction 2, which is a distraction. Remove "1" from remaining example.
2025-09	248	268	Improve	[Kantar pp. 55-63, Vic Quiros, Aug 2025 Bulletin, "Vic's Views" (4) 1S-4NT 6-KQJT8765-A-AKQ] The primary rule: there is no RKB for a suit we could have first set as trump [invalidates the recommended choice, in some cases]. A 4NT response to an opening bid asks for aces (0, 1, 2 3). After a 2/1 response, when opener rebids their own or a new suit, responder's 4NT is RKB for responder's suit (raise to set one of opener's suits trump). 4NT is quantitative on the third round or over a notrump bid. Mention "last bid suit," could apply: {1m-1M; 4NT}, more. Recalibrate the choices. Propagate all thru the rest of the chapter. [Index David Caprera, Hamish Brown.] Choice: default for 4 NT is quantitative.
2026-03	248	268	Improve	Kantar repeatedly refutes the "last bid suit" method for a jump to 4 NT as RKB. I need to address this specifically, even tho 4 NT is usually RKB only for spades, for us.

2026-03	248	268	Improve	I. "For purposes of EKB only, if no trump suit has been agreed, and the last bid was a suit, that suit is trump." Starting at "and," Kantar's phrasing was: "the last bid suit is trump." The difference is when the last bid was notrump. Resolve or offer choice.
2026-03	248	268	Add	New K (old K -> L): In a game-forcing auction, an own-suit jump rebid below game sets trump and demands control-bidding. Examples: {2C-2D; 3H}, {1H-2C; 3H}, {1H-2C; 2any 4C}.
